







Wisdom In A Children's Song -- *Oh Be Careful*

Sometimes those of us who are older are embarrassed to sing what we call "children's songs." However, some of the most profound lessons are found in some of these songs. This article will look at the song "Oh Be Careful." If more adults would pay attention to this song and stop thinking it is just for children, many souls would be headed in a more clear direction toward heaven and many marriages and families would be saved as well. First, this song teaches us to be careful what our little eyes see. When we think what we see on T.V., in movies, and what many people see in pornography, it is difficult to even imagine the total impact those images have in our hearts and lives as a whole. All of us need to be as Job was when he

stated in Job 31:1 that he had "made a covenant with his eyes" not to look upon those things he should not behold.

Second, this song teaches us to be careful what our little ears hear and say. There are at least 31 references in the book of Proverbs to things that we should hear or not hear. Music has taken such a great place in our lives in America. When we stop to truly listen to the lyrics to some of the most popular songs we find lyrics that describe explicit sexual acts, acts of extreme violence, or at times even blaspheming and mocking God. If you are like me, you probably don't know the words to many of these songs but listen to them anyway. Some of those messages that are planted in our minds can affect our outlook. Think also of many of the conversations you hear or in which you participate. You may already be saying that you would not "be caught dead" listening to the kind of music described above. However, without thought sometimes we engage in gossip, conversations that divide, talk about other people, or tell jokes or stories that should not be told. There are individuals who take God's name in vain or curse in other ways. God teaches us that ...*evil communications corrupt good morals* (I Corinthians 15:33). God's message is clear, we will reap what we sow. If we "sow to the flesh" in what we see and hear, we will reap what we sow with sin in our lives. (Galatians 6:7-8) May we listen to Paul's advice in Ephesians 4:29 to *Let no unwholesome word proceed from your mouth, but only such a word as is good for edification according to the need of the moment, so that it will give grace to those who hear.* May we be involved in conversations, both in what we say and what we choose to listen to, that build up and do not tear down.

Third, we are taught to be careful what our hands do. The things we do cause us to be either defiled or made clean. We want to be careful to be made clean. Loving God means keeping his commandments (John 14:21-24). Our relationship with God is more than just being religious. It is completed by what we do. We must do good for others (The Good Samaritan - Luke 10:30-37) as well as doing good toward God. Our life's work is to do whatever we do with all our might (Ecclesiastes 9:10). We must truly learn to do good by "fearing God and keeping his commandments" because that is what man's life is all about. (Ecclesiastes 12:13)

Finally, we must be thoughtful about where we go. Proverbs 4:25-27 teaches us that our ways will be established if we watch where we walk, Paul instructed Timothy to flee youthful lusts and pursue righteousness (II Timothy 2:22). Joseph set a great example in Genesis 37:7-12 by refusing to go to bed with Potiphar's wife and then when she continued her pursuit of him, he ran away from the temptation. Proverbs 1 is a great place to see that we should not walk in the counsel of the ungodly, nor stand in the path of sinners, nor sit in the seat of the scornful. Proverbs 2:20 teaches us to walk in the paths of righteousness.

What great life lessons can be learned from this simple "children's" song. God bless us to learn these great lessons.

Have you checked out the church website lately? This tool can be used in many ways. Here are a few important things to know:

1. Website address is www.hendersoncoc.com
2. Navigation tabs (About Us, Media, Ministries, Church Life, Contact Us) all have drop down menus underneath them.

3. You can listen to sermons from the sermon archive (currently has sermons from January 2014 through this past Sunday). You can search by topic, date, series, speaker and it also lists the most recent sermons added.
4. The Messenger can be opened from the Media tab.
5. The church directory is located under the Church Life tab. **You will need a password to open the directory.** You can get the password from me or you can call into the office. **We ask that you not share this password with others.** This feature is just for our members.
6. Under the ministries tab, there are tabs for specific groups within our church, such as youth group, senior adults, Faith & Family class, etc. More can be added. We want these groups to use this as a way to communicate better with each other and to the congregation as a whole.
7. The website will be updated regularly. We are still working on a few features that will be added later. Once those are ready, we will explain how to use them.
8. You can leave a comment or make a request under the Contact Us tab. These comments come to my email and I will respond as soon as possible.

In addition to the website, there are several ways that we try to communicate the happenings of the church. The **TELL** line is updated M-F and is a good source of information, especially to find out about those that are in the hospital or have things we need to be prayerful about. That number is 989-8355(TELL). **The Messenger** is updated twice a month on the website. A few copies are provided at the Welcome Center for those that don't have access to the website. Also, several groups within the church have their own **Facebook** page, which they use to communicate specifically about their class.
