When You Know You Have A True Friend

"The soul of Jonathan was knit to the soul of David, and Jonathan loved him as himself... he loved him as he loved his own life" (1 Samuel 18:2; 20:17).

A True Friend Sees Beyond Himself

• Jonathan made a covenant with David (18:3-4).

• He gave David his robe, armor, sword, bow, and belt, in essence pronouncing David as the next king.

• Later, David bowed three times to Jonathan in gratitude for saving his life (20:41). There was no ego in their relationship, but genuine love and care.

A True Friend Stands With You

• "Saul was David's enemy continually" (18:29).

• "Jonathan spoke well of David to Saul his father" (19:4).

• "Why should he be put to death? What has he done?" (20:32).

• A true friend is there whenever you need them.

A True Friend Is Always Missed

• "They wept together, but David wept the more" (20:41).

• "Jonathan said to David, 'Go in safety, the Lord will be between me and you, and between my descendants and your descendants forever'" (20:42).

• "Jonathan went to David and encouraged him in God, and said, 'Do not be afraid, you will be king over Israel and I will be next to you'" (23:16-17).

A True Friend Keeps His Word

• In 2 Samuel 9 King David learned of Jonathan's crippled son, Mephibosheth.

• David brought him into his home to eat at his table and become a member of his family.

• Even after Jonathan's death, David kept his word that he would care for Jonathan's descendants.

Take Home Lessons

• To have a good friend you must be a good friend (Prov. 18:24); do not expect more from them than you are willing to give them.

• We must be wise in choosing our true friendships (2 Cor. 6:14).

• We must always remember there is no greater privilege than to be called a "friend of God" (James 2:23).
