"Faith or Works"

James 2:14-26.

Contradiction or Complimentary?

- "Therefore we conclude that a man is justified by faith apart from the deeds of the law."
 Romans 3:28
- "You see then that a man is justified by works, and not by faith only." James 2:24
- Who is right? Does scripture contradict itself?
 Are the passages both inspired by God?
- What does James actually say?

Works actively demonstrate our faith

- "If a brother or sister is naked and destitute of daily food, 16 and one of you says to them, "Depart in peace, be warmed and filled," but you do not give them the things which are needed for the body, what does it profit?"
 (v.15)
- "Show me your faith without your works, and I will show you my faith by my works." (v.18)
- The implication is that without works, it is not possible to demonstrate the reality of faith.

Faith Alone is not Enough

- The Devils have made amazing confessions:
 - ""Let us alone! What have we to do with You, Jesus of Nazareth? Did You come to destroy us? I know who You are—the Holy One of God!" (Mark 1:24)
 - "What have I to do with You, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I implore You by God that You do not torment me." (Mark 5:7)
 - "You believe that there is one God. You do well. Even the demons believe—and tremble!" (2:19)
 - Two kinds of faith: (1) Intellectual (2) practical.

Illustration of Two Faith Qualities (2:21ff)

- Abraham demonstrated absolute submission.
 - "Abraham believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness." (Romans 4:3)
 - Was not Abraham our father justified by works when he offered Isaac his son on the altar?
 (James 2:21) "Now I Know..." (Gen. 22:12)
- Rahab demonstrated risk and trust in God.
 - "Likewise, was not Rahab the harlot also justified by works when she received the messengers and sent them out another way?" (2:25)
