### The Proper View of Self

Too often, we are more selfish than selfless.

 It is not about our way, our rights, our plans, our wishes, our desires, or our style.

We must learn the discipline of self-denial (Luke 9:23).



#### The Proper View of Submission

• It is not about how little we can do for the Lord, but how much because of our love for Him (1 John 4:19).

We work out of love, not duty; out of gratitude, not fear.

• Let's apply this to attendance at worship services, giving, study, prayer, visitation, and teaching.



#### The Proper View of Sin

 There are sins of both commission and omission, what we have done wrong, and failed to do that is right.

• A false view of sin leads to a false view of security, that we are "not so bad" (Luke 18:9-14).

The failure to do right is just as sinful (James 4:17).

## The Proper View of Service

 Every judgment parable reveals punishment for what one failed to do rather than what was done wrong.

 Here are three timely examples: the one talent man (Matt. 25); the rich man (Luke 16); and the sheep and the goats (Matt. 25).

• These should be somber warnings for us.

Love them anyway. Do good anyway. Succeed anyway. Be honest and frank anyway. Think big anyway. Fight for a few underdogs anyway. Build anyway. Help people anyway. Give the world the best you have anyway.
