Revelation & Inspiration

Revelation: Divine disclosure of what was previously unknown to humans

- ▶ General revelation (Psa. 19:1-6)
- ▶ Special revelation (Psa. 19:7-14)

Neh. 9:20, 30; Isa. 63:11, 14; Hag. 2:5; 2 Sam. 23:2

Luke 2:26; Mat. 10:20; Acts 11:28

John 16:13; Eph. 3:4-5

Revelation & Inspiration

Inspiration: the process by which the Holy Spirit protected God's revelation through human writers from error, down to the very words used.

- ▶ 2 Peter 1:16-21
- ▶ 2 Timothy 3:16

How? – Sometimes through direct command (cf. Exo. 34:27), sometimes recording their own thoughts (cf. Deut. 3:23-26), but always under the direction of the Holy Spirit.

Heb. 3:7-11, *citing Psa. 95:7-11*
Heb. 9:1-8, *citing Exo. 25-26*
Heb. 10:15-17, *citing Jer. 31:33-34*

Many passages in Revelation allude to other biblical texts
(e.g., Rev. 2:7, 11, 17, 29; 3:6, 13, 22; 14:13)

Instruction

Illumination

- ▶ Psalm 119:18, 27, 34, 73, 125, 144, 169
- ▶ He illuminates through the word he has revealed / inspired.
- ▶ His illumination through his word doesn't guarantee that all will agree on it because not all will approach it honestly.
- ▶ His illumination does not mean everything about God is knowable.
- ▶ His illumination does not mean human teachers are unnecessary.
- ▶ His illumination is not a substitute for personal Bible study.
- ▶ His illumination is not unique to you.

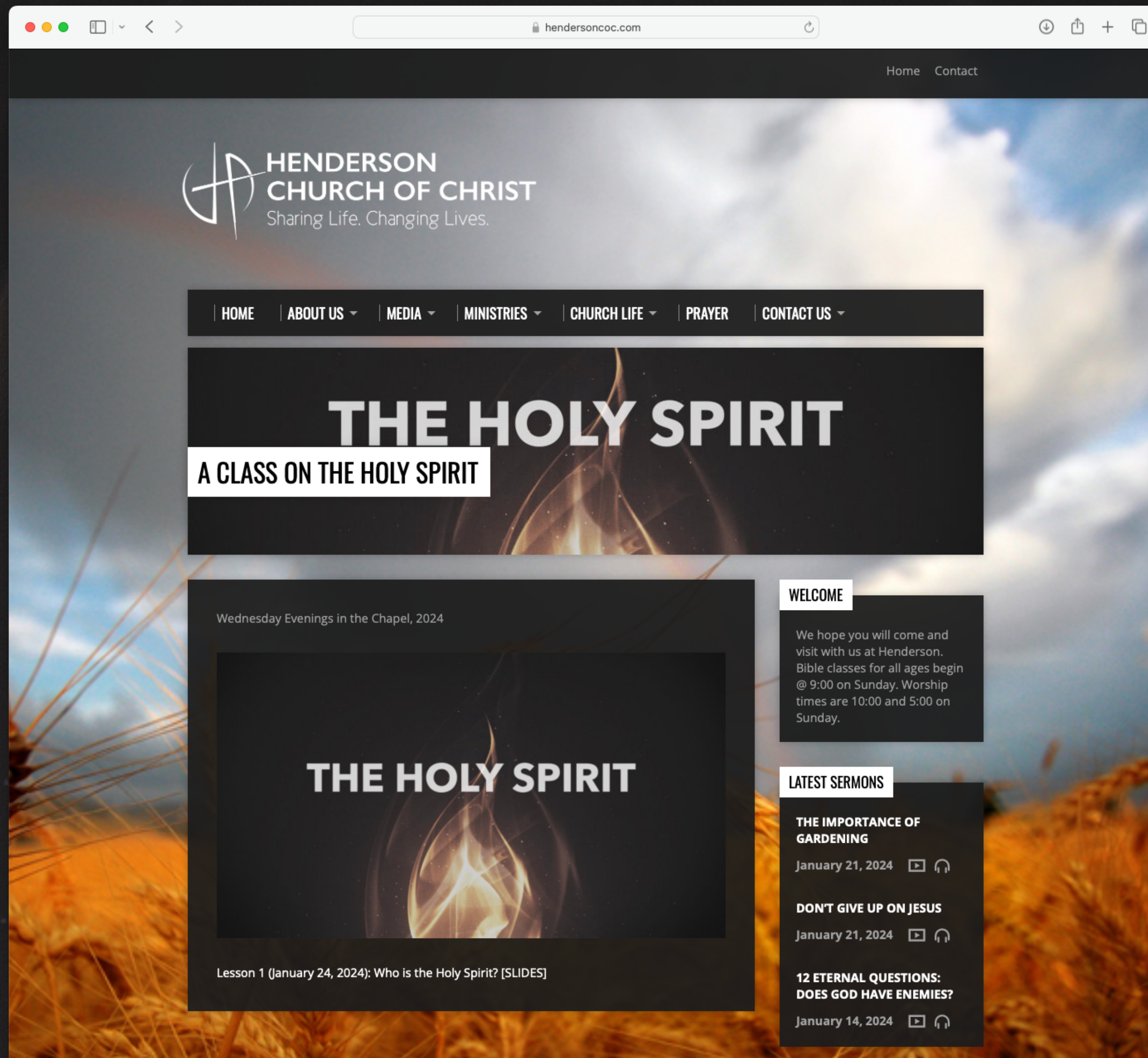
